A Report from the President's Desk...

Although it has been a while since our last newsletter and Yorktown Civic Association meeting, rest assured ... the Yorktown Civic Association Executive Committee (YCA EC) has been hard at work behind the scenes. On January 9th, the Yorktown Civic Association hosted Noah Simon, the Chair of the 26th Street and Old Dominion Drive Task. Noah gave the Association an update on the progress of the 26th Street and Old Dominion Drive Task and provided YCA with the latest news from Representative Beyer's office where he is the District Director for constituent services and community outreach.

From November 2018 until April 2019, I represented YCA on the 26th Street and Old Dominion Task Force. The Task Force was charged with helping the county government decide what to do with the county-owned seven acre site. In March, I wrote a letter to the County Board asking them to modify the charge and remove the highly prescriptive language requiring the Task Force to

retain the one acre leaf storage site as part of the Task Force's planning efforts. The county board responded by letter and rejected my request. On April 15th, the Task Force approved the consensus report. I voted against the report. Unfortunately, I predict that very little will change at the site for at least a decade.

In other activities, YCA EC members continued to advocate for trees and park improvements. Please read the article by our newest YCA EC member, Amelia Frenkel.

In Lee Highway Alliance news, the County Board approved monies for the LHA, but at a significantly lower level than we requested. Several community forums have already been held and more are planned for this summer. Please participate. We need your input. Please Google "Lee Highway Alliance" for more information.



Another responsibility of the YCA EC is to review and support (or not support) "Use Permit" requests. In April, I reviewed two requests to re-purpose two banks (5222 Lee Hwy & 5322 Lee Hwy) and turn them into childcare businesses. Access to affordable childcare is a top concern for many Arlingtonians.

The Yorktown Civic Association Executive Committee continues to move toward incorporating the civic association as a 501(C)4 non-profit corporation. The draft bylaws are almost done and will be posted on the Yorktown Civic Association website soon. If you have any expertise in bylaws for non-profit organizations, please contact me.

Please pay your dues. Annual membership dues are \$20 and lifetime membership dues are \$100. The Yorktown Civic Association newsletter reaches over 2000 local households. New trees lining the median on N George Mason Drive

You may have noticed a row of new trees lining the median on N George Mason Drive, one of the most well-trafficked entrances to the Yorktown neighborhood. The trees are native Redbuds, and they are a product of several years of advocacy by YCA Board Member Amelia Frenkel.

The turning point of that advocacy came at the May 2018 meeting of the Yorktown Civic Association. County Board member Libby Garvey attended the meeting as a special guest and took questions from the audience,

including one from Ms. Frenkel about the stalled effort to secure plantings from the County. Garvey followed up with county staff, who have personally come to ensure that the new trees are thriving and have all the care and water they need to grow.

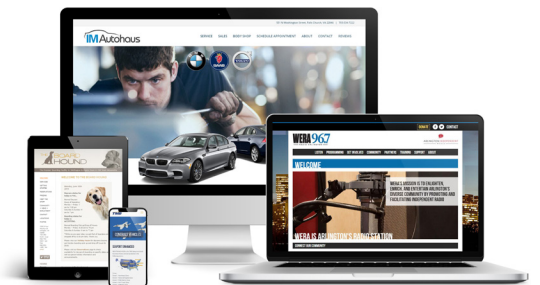
